INSTALLATION MANUAL FOR ROOM AIR CONDITIONER

(Split Wall-Mounted Type)

Α

- For correct installation, read this manual before starting installation and save this manual in a safe place for future reference.
- Only trained and qualified service personnel should install, repair or service air conditioning equipment. Users should not install the air conditioner by themselves.
- All pictures are only sketches. If there is any difference between pictures in this manual and the actual shape of the air conditioner you purchased, the actual shape shall prevail.

INSTALLATION PRECAUTION

Installation in the following places may cause trouble. If it is unavoidable, please, consult with the local dealer.

- A place full of machine oil.
- A saline place such as coast.
- A place full of sulfide gas such as hot-spring resort.
- Places where there are high frequency machines such as wireless equipment, welding machine, and medical facility.
- A place where there is combustible gases and volatile matter.
- A place of special environmental conditions.

Indoor Unit

- A place where there is no obstacle near the inlet and outlet area.
- A place which can bear the weight of the indoor unit.
- A place which is convenient to maintenance.
 A place which provides the space around.
- A place which provides the space around the indoor unit as required right in the diagram.
- A place 1m or more to TV, radio instrument, in the center of the room is perfect.
- A place which is far from heat, steam and inflammable gas.

Outdoor Unit

- A place, which is convenient to installation and not exposed to a strong wind. A place that is dry and ventilated.
- A place that can bear the weight of the outdoor unit and where the outdoor unit can be held in the horizontal position.
- A place which does not allow an increase in noise level and vibration.
- A place where the operation noise and discharge air do not disturb your neighbor or animals.
- A place free of a leakage of combustible gases.
- An allowable head level at the connective piping is less than 16ft and length of the connective piping is up less than 33ft.
- No obstacle which can block air.
- Unavailable to children.
- A place, which provides the space around the outdoor unit as required in the diagram


Please install the accessories attached with unit correctly according to this installation manual.

Note:

- 1. Be sure sides A, B, and C are free from blockage.
- 2. When the Outdoor Unit is higher than the Indoor Units, to prevent the rain from flowing into the indoor along the connection pipe, a downward tipping arc should be made before the connection pipe entering the wall to indoor to ensure the lowest point on the connection pipe is outdoor.
- The illustration above is only a sketch. Models may be slightly different.

Anchor out door unit

- The outdoor unit should not be exposed to strong wind.
- Anchor the outdoor unit with 1/4" or 5/16" anchor bolts.



Cautions on remote controller installation

- Keep the remote controller at least 3ft from the nearest TV set or stereo equipment.
- equipment.
 Do not install the remote controller in a place exposed to direct sunlight or close to a heating source, such as a stove.
- Note that the positive and negative poles are correct when loading batteries.




1 INDOOR UNIT INSTALLATION

1. Drilling A Hole and Mounting Installation Plate

The Installation Plate will look like one of the following(Depending on models):

Installation Plate and Its Dimension (Unit: in.)



1. Fix the installation plate.

- Install the installation plate horizontally on structural parts in the wall with the spaces provided around the plate.
- In case of brick, concrete or similar type walls, use appropriate anchors and mounting screws.
- 3. Attach the installation plate to the wall.




2. Drilling a hole.

1. Per the diagram above determine the pipe hole position using the installation plate, drill the pipe hole (φ 2.5 in.),the outside pipe hole is 1/4 to 1/2 inch lower than the inside one, so it slants slightly downward.

2. Connective Pipe and Drainage Installation

1. Drainage

Run the drain hose sloping downward. Do not install the drain hose as illustrated below.



2. When extending the drain hose,





3. Piping and wrapping


insulate appropriately.

Wind the connective cable, drain hose and wiring with tape securely, evenly as shown below.


 Because the condensed water from the indoor unit is gathered in a drain pan and is piped out of room, do not place anything in the pan.



2. Connecting pipe



- For left-hand and right-hand piping, remove the pipe cover from the side panel.
- The pipe cover be kept as it may be used when the air conditioner is moved to any other place.
- 2. For the left-hand and rear-left-hand piping, install the piping as shown. Bend the pipe so it is no more than 1.75 inches from the wall.




 Attach the end of the pipe to the fittings on the indoor unit.

CAUTION

- Connect the indoor unit first then the outdoor
- unit and bend and arrange the pipe carefully.Do not allow the piping to let out from the
- back of the indoor unit.Be careful not to let the drain hose slack.
- Insulate both of pipes.
- Wrap the drain hose with the pipes.
- Do not allow the power cable and control
- cable be crossed.



3. Indoor Unit Installation

- 1. Pass the piping through the hole in the wall.
- 2. Put the upper claw at the back of the indoor unit on the upper hook of the installation plate, move the indoor unit from side to side to see that it is securely hooked
- 3. Piping can easily be made by lifting the indoor unit with a cushioning material between the indoor unit and the wall. Remove after finish piping.
- 4. Push the lower part of the indoor unit up on the wall, Then move the indoor unit from side to side, up and down to check if it is hooked securely.

4. Wiring

The outdoor unit must be connected to a dedicated power source. The indoor unit is powered from the outdoor unit through the interconnecting cable. The indoor unit requires no separate power source.


The supply voltage must comply with the rated voltage of the air conditioner:


CAUTION

- Wiring to the unit and between the indoor and outdoor sections must be in compliance with NEC and local codes
- Do not extend the power cable code by splicing.
- Voltage should in the range of 90%~110% of rated voltage.
- The air conditioner must be grounded.
- To determine wire size and maximum fuse size for the circuit, see the unit rating

5. Connecting Cables

- 1. Indoor/Outdoor connection cable should be AWG 18 or heavier, SJOW cord.
- 2. Open the panel, remove the Electrical Box cover by loosening the screw (For <12000Btu/h models). Remove the panel and Screw Covers , then loosen the screws and take down the frame (For ≥12000Btu/h models).
- 3. Connect cables according to their marks to terminals.
- Wrap those cables not connected with terminals with insulation tapes, so that they will not touch any electrical components.






② OUTDOOR UNIT INSTALLATION

1. OUTDOOR INSTALLATION PRECAUTION


- Install the outdoor unit on a rigid base to prevent increasing noise level and vibration. Determine the air outlet direction where the discharged air is not blocked.
- In the case that the installation place is exposed to strong wind such as a seaside operation, put the unit lengthwise along the wall or using a dust or shield plates.
- Especially in windy areas, install the unit to prevent the admission of wind.
- If suspending the unit, the installation bracket should be in accordance with technique requirements in the installation bracket diagram. The connection between bracket and wall, bracket and the air conditioner should be firm, stable and reliable.
- Be sure there is no obstacle which will block radiating air.



3. REFRIGERANT PIPING CONNECTION

1. Flaring

1. Cut a pipe with a pipe cutter.



2. Insert a flare nut into a pipe and flare the

2. Tightening Connection

Align pipes to be connected.

Sufficiently tighten the flare nut with fingers, and then tighten it with a spanner and torque



2. DRAIN ELBOW INSTALLATION




Fit the seal into the drain elbow, then insert the drain elbow into the base pan hole of outdoor unit, rotate 90° to securely assemble them. Connecting the drain elbow with an extension drain hose (Locally purchased), in case of the water draining off the outdoor unit during the heating mode.


4. WIRING CONNECTION

- 1. Remove the cover control from the unit by loosening the 3 screws.
- 2. Dismount caps on the conduit panel.
- 3. Temporarily mount the conduit tubes (not included) on the conduit panel.
- 4. Properly connect both the power supply and low voltage lines to the corresponding terminals on the terminal block.
- 5. Ground the unit in accordance with local codes.
- 6. Be sure to size each wire allowing several inches longer than the required length for
- 7. Use lock nuts to secure the conduit tubes.

WARNING

- Be sure to comply with local codes while running the wire from the indoor unit to the outdoor unit.
- Every wire must be connected firmly. No wire should be allowed to touch refrigerant tubing, the compressor
- or any moving parts. Loose wiring may cause the terminal to overheat or result in unit malfunction.
- A fire hazard may also exit. Therefore. be sure all wiring is tightly connected.
- Disconnecting means must be provided and shall be located within sight from and readily accessible from the air conditioner.
- Connecting cable with conduit shall go through the hole of the conduit panel.

③ AIR PURGE AND TEST OPERATION

1. AIR PURGE


Choose purge method from the table:

• For the R407C/R410A refrigerant models, make sure the refrigerant added into air conditioner is liquid form in all cases.

CAUTION IN HANDING THE PACKED VALVE


- Open the valve stem until it hits against the stop. Do not try to open it further.
- Securely tighten the valve stem cap with a spanner or the like.
- Valve stem cap tightening torque. Gas pipe side (ϕ 0.38): 23.52N.cm (300kgf.cm) Liquid pipe side (Φ 0.25): 12.56N.cm (160kgf.cm)



When Using the Vacuum Pump

(For method of using a manifold valve, refer to its operation manual.)

- 1. Completely tighten the flare nuts, A, B, C, D, connect the manifold valve charge hose to a charge port of the low-pressure valve on the gas pipe side.
- 2. Connect the charge hose connection to the vacuum pump.
- 3. Fully open the handle Lo of the manifold valve.
- Operate the vacuum pump to evacuate. After starting evacuation slightly loose the flare nut of the Lo valve on the gas pipe side and check that the air is entering.(Operation noise of the vacuum pump changes and a compound meter indicates 0 instead of minus)
- 5. After the evacuation is complete, fully close the handle Lo of the manifold valve and stop the operation of the vacuum pump.
- Make evacuation for 15 minutes and more and check that the compound meter indicates -29.92 in Hg(-1.0x105Pa)
- 6. Turn the stem of the packed valve B about 45° counterclockwise for 6~7 seconds after the gas coming out, then tighten the flare nut again. Make sure the pressure display in the pressure indicator is a little higher than the atmosphere pressure.
- 7. Remove the charge hose from the Low pressure charge hose.
- 8. Fully open the packed valve stems B and A.
- 9. Securely tighten the cap of the packed valve.




2. GAS LEAK CHECK

Make sure no gas come out from connections with leak detector or soap water.



A: Lo packed valve B: Hi packed valve C and D are ends of indoor unit connection.



3. TEST OPERATION

Perform test operation after completing gas leak check and installation Check that all tubing and wiring have been properly connected.

- 1. Connect the power, push the COOL button on the control panel to
- 2. Check if all the functions work well while testing the air conditioner.
- Aprotection feature prevents the air conditioner from being activated for abut 3 minutes when it is restarted immediately after operation or when the powerswitch is turned on.
- 3. Push the COOL button again till the running light switches off after finishing the test operation.
